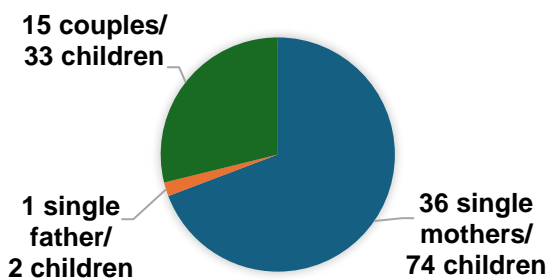


*More than half of the 86 assistance awards this year have benefitted families with children.*

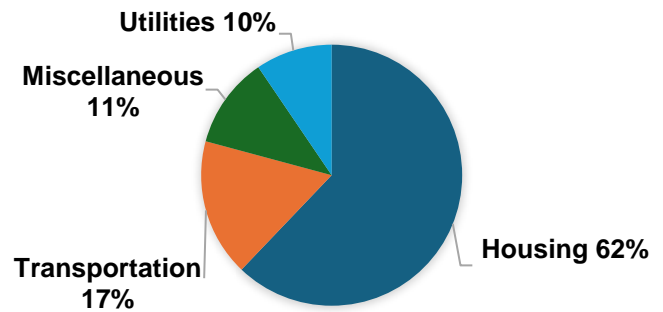
It comes as no surprise to us that most of the applications we receive are on behalf of women. Women make up just over half of the adults living in Ontario County, but they are far more likely to be living in poverty or in the ALICE (Asset Limited Income Constrained) population. They are also far more likely to be raising children on their own. Another grim statistic stands out for us: of the 52 requests for assistance we have approved for single women this year, nearly half were women who had recently escaped domestic violence. And more than 60% of those women had children.

Donations to N2N provided our struggling neighbors with emergency funding for safe housing, transportation, utilities and other needs.

## THE IMPACT of GENEROSITY

Knowing that N2N can act quickly, Safe Harbors of the Finger Lakes sent an emergency request on behalf of a mother of four children fleeing persistent domestic violence. This young woman was able to free herself and her children from an abusive environment, but she had very limited funds to pay the upfront costs for a new apartment for her family of five. To keep this family safe, Neighbor to Neighbor, the Salvation Army and Safe Harbors partnered to help with the cost of the security deposit to ensure this young family could quickly relocate to a safe and affordable environment.

Family Counseling Service of the Finger Lakes reached out to N2N on behalf of a couple who are struggling to pay their bills while dealing with ongoing medical issues. The husband collects social security income, but his wife's income keeps them financially on track. They've fallen behind on several bills, utilities being just one. Stories like this one are common. Families living paycheck to paycheck are upended financially after a medical event has prevented them from working. Providing them with assistance to maintain utility service is just one small way to help them during a difficult period.
