A NOTE from CINDY VANDERLEE

Homelessness doesn't always look like what we imagine.

It can mean a family crowded into a single motel room, or children crowded onto a couch in the home of a friend or relative. A family living in a motel may be relocated every month to a different motel anywhere in – or outside - Ontario County. Without a stove and with only a small refrigerator and a microwave or hotplate, preparing fresh, healthy meals is nearly impossible. For many families, these conditions last not just weeks, but months – or even more than a year – before they are able to find permanent, affordable housing.

In 2008, 16% of our students' families were considered economically disadvantaged. *Today, that number has climbed to 42%*. While being economically disadvantaged does not necessarily mean a family is homeless, it does place them at greater risk. Families struggling to afford rent, utilities, or even essential car repairs to maintain employment are far more vulnerable to experiencing homelessness.

As our district faces a record number of families who are homeless -68 families in the 2023-2024 school year - we are witnessing the deep and lasting impact it has on our students and their families. Neighbor to Neighbor has made a tremendous difference by providing financial assistance that prevents homelessness and helps families secure stable, permanent housing. We've seen fi




homelessness and helps families secure stable, permanent housing. We've seen firsthand what this means for our families: children thrive in school, parents can focus on work, and stability replaces constant worry. For our students and their families, that stability is life changing.

FOCUS on CHILDREN

This year, Neighbor to Neighbor has helped 155 families throughout Ontario County. Altogether 169 children have benefitted from our support to keep them housed, to keep their homes heated, to provide them with reliable transportation to school, activities and doctor's appointments, to give them beds to sleep on.

More than half of these children live in Geneva or Canandaigua.

And far too many – *63 of the 169 children* – are fleeing domestic violence with their mothers.

The IMPACT of YOUR GENEROSITY

We have seen a 62% increase this year in requests for emergency assistance and a 70% increase in the amount of funding we have provided. Your continued generosity allows us to respond immediately to emergency situations, such as these:

- A single mother spent most of this year at the Ronald McDonald House while her infant received intensive care at the hospital and her two older children lived with their grandmother. Her limited income made it nearly impossible to secure housing where the family could be reunited after the baby's discharge. With N2N's assistance and a landlord willing to be flexible with rent and security deposit she was able to bring her children together under one roof and maintain stability.
- A self-employed man had been seriously ill and unable to work for much of this year. He refinanced his home to reduce his monthly expenses, but his limited funds still prevented him from paying off past due propane bills and purchase the propane he needs for heat and hot water. A funding partnership between N2N, the St Vincent de Paul Society and Canandaigua Churches in Action helped him purchase his heating fuel.

Thank you to more than 125 INDIVIDUALS, FAMILIES and the following BUSINESSES, COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS and FOUNDATIONS.

Together, they have contributed more than \$120,000 since January of this year.
